About Oxley Creek's transformation

Brisbane City Council is investing \$100 million over 20 years to transform the Oxley Creek corridor into a lifestyle and leisure destination, providing residents and visitors with more opportunities to enjoy Brisbane's natural environment.

Oxley Creek is one of the Brisbane River's major tributaries. Beginning in the Scenic Rim, south of Ipswich, it joins the Brisbane River approximately 70 kilometres downstream at Graceville. The creek and its surrounds have endured a long history of land uses that have degraded its health and condition, limiting its ability to positively contribute to Brisbane's greenspace network.

The Oxley Creek Transformation project is the next stage of our work towards improving the environmental health of Oxley Creek and making it a place for the people of Brisbane to enjoy. It builds on the achievements of the Lord Mayor's Oxley Creek Catchment Taskforce, as well as past on-ground works delivered through Habitat Brisbane, Community Conservation Partnerships programs, and many other projects and programs championed by both Council and community groups over the years.

The Oxley Creek Transformation Master Plan released in 2018, plans for new and upgraded parklands, recreation facilities, community hubs, environmental restoration and connections for people and wildlife.



Graceville Riverside Parklands vision

To enhance the existing qualities of the parklands and improve connections to the river, creek and wider Oxley Creek corridor.



Creating a riverside recreation and activity precinct.

A place to slow down, get active or celebrate with the community.

Enhancing and protecting our natural assets.

A location that respects, complements and protects the natural environment. Establishing a gateway for adventures along Oxley Creek.

A starting point for exploring the creek corridor by bike, watercraft or on foot.





Graceville Riverside Parklands is bounded by the Brisbane River and Oxley Creek. The parklands are filled with pockets of shade provided by eucalypt, mango and fig trees and hoop pines. Simpsons 'boat park' Playground provides a setting for children's adventures, while the Sea Scout hall, Canoe Club and associated water-access pontoon, supply a steady buzz of community activity.

The Graceville Riverside Parklands Precinct Plan is the latest part of the Oxley Creek Transformation project's ongoing commitment to plan and deliver Brisbane's newest environmental and recreational asset.

This plan proposes enhancements to the parklands to improve the function, character, and identity of park features already appreciated by the community, while establishing a key gateway into the Oxley Creek corridor and a hub for water-based recreation.

The feedback received during community engagement has played a key role in shaping the final document reflecting an ongoing commitment to work together with the community to deliver places and experiences that offer a diverse range of recreational and leisure opportunities. 
Enhancing the parklands

Spaces to play, exercise and relax

Situated under a grove of mature trees, the existing boat playground will be the centrepiece of a new play space designed to encourage imagination and curiosity. Getting to the parklands will be an adventure with the new Junior Greenway. Kids of all ages will enjoy the scooter and cycle obstacle detours located parallel to pathways within the precinct. New exercise stations on the riverside exercise circuit will challenge those seeking a workout. Open grassed areas with picnic shelters and electric barbecues will adjoin the playground, while grassed areas under large shade trees will provide a range of locations to lay out a picnic blanket.

A community green in the centre of the parklands will provide the setting for local community and cultural celebrations and double as a large open space for informal play and relaxation. Fringed by shady mature trees, the community green will be event-ready with power and water available, while soft feature lighting will support activity extending into the early evening.

An outdoor classroom

The Oxley Creek Junior Ranger Program will host an on-ground discovery trail that will build children's knowledge of First Nations People and European history, as well as the environmental challenges associated with an urban waterway.

Environmental rehabilitation efforts within the parklands will focus on strengthening existing wildlife corridors, as well as increasing the width of riparian vegetation and creek-edge mangroves. Weed management and new native plantings will encourage natural regeneration of the original ecosystems to increase habitat. Park improvements will explore the opportunity to increase the amount of local native tree shade cover.



Continuing to deliver for Oxley Creek


The Oxley Creek Transformation Master Plan continues to act as a catalyst for change. Priority Projects identified in the Plan are coming to life.

The first stage of Warril (Nature-based Adventure) Parkland is now complete, construction is underway on the Archerfield Wetlands Discovery Trail and the district Parkland at Archerfield Wetlands will commence construction in 2022.

Planning and investigations have commenced on both The Greenway and environmental improvement projects associated with the Strategic Corridor Restoration Plan.

Graceville Riverside Parklands' enhancements will be undertaken in stages to ensure there is minimal impact to the existing functions of the parkland. Further planning, stakeholder consultation, detailed design and technical studies will be required in order to ensure the improvements respond to the site's characteristics
